

Headed to college? We want to help!

Transcending Through Education Foundation was started by three former ACI inmates who improved their lives through higher education. They want to help others to do the same by providing funds, workshops, and mentorships. Apply for a TTEF scholarship!

> All applicants must:

- Be accepted to a program of vocational training or post-secondary education that awards a degree, a license, or a certificate by the time scholarships are awarded. (You may apply while awaiting acceptance).
- > Incarcerated applicants (for correspondence courses, or after release) must:
 - Demonstrate that the academic term will not be disrupted by release. (*TTEF encourages those who anticipate release to apply to colleges once released.*) If you are not released as anticipated, the award will (subject to TTEF's discretion) be held until enrollment.
- Formerly incarcerated applicants must:
 - Apply within one year of being released from prison, or court-ordered inpatient facility.
- Scholarships may only be used for tuition, books, or school fees. Awards vary depending on the cost of your program. The maximum amount awarded is \$1,000.

** If any applicants do not meet the above requirements, they may apply for special consideration. Reason(s) for special consideration must be attached to application.

Selection Criteria

We look for people able to demonstrate leadership qualities, community involvement, and a commitment to education. You are required to submit academic transcripts, including GED or SAT test scores if applicable. Candidates must also answer three short essay questions.
